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Minutes of Meeting held on 14th June 2023 at Newton Village Hall

23/116 Apologies for Absence

Cllr Taylor (holiday) sent his apologies.

23/117 Declaration of Interests and Requests for Dispensation

No interests were declared and no request for dispensation had been received.

23/118 Minutes of Meeting held on 17th May 2023

The minutes of the meeting were approved by the councillors, who resolved that the minutes should be signed by the Chairman as a correct record.

23/119 Public Participation

The councillors reviewed James Finch's previously submitted report and he updated councillors on the additional Ukrainian refugee support, waste collection and fostering and adoption. He will follow up on the repair to the culvert (23/038) and the enforcement action relating to the quarry works off Valley Road. Lee Parker updated councillors on the formation of Babergh's cabinet and Newton's planning applications.

23/120 Emails circulated

The councillors reviewed an email from a resident who wanted to understand if there were plans to leave the Recreation Ground uncut in order to improve diversity. The Recreation Ground is owned by Newton Green Trust (NGT) and NPC has permission to have the play equipment, MUGA and fitness equipment in the field. As part of the agreement, NPC maintains the grass and hedging around its equipment, benches and picnic tables. NPC considers that the areas around its equipment should be cut so that it can maintain the correct H&S policy for adults, children and dogs using the area. The remainder of the field is maintained by NGT and the council agreed to pass the correspondence to them so that they can communicate with the resident.

23/121 Clerk's Report (Appendix A)

The Clerk was asked to write again to the household in Rotten Row (23/074) and the bench is to be located on the raised ground between the MUGA fencing and the zip wire in the Recreation Ground (23/090c). They also requested that one bench be moved to be inside the under-7 fenced play equipment area.

23/122 Finance

- a. All payments made and due for authorisation, as itemised in the RFO Report (Appendix B) as well as a payment to Flowers Groundcare for £100 were authorised by the councillors. The councillors also noted the income received since the last meeting, the reconciliation of accounts, the Statement of Accounts vs Budget and the spending commitment.
- b. The councillors resolved to purchase a new green litter bin for Plampin Close with a budget of £340 + VAT from CIL receipts.

23/123 Planning

a. The councillors reviewed **Planning Application DC/23/02254 17 Church Road** - Erection of porch extension and resolved to support the application.

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- b. No further planning application had been received since the agenda was posted requiring a response before the next scheduled meeting.
- c. The councillors reviewed the status of previous applications, appeals and enforcement referrals (Appendix C).

23/124 **Newton Footpaths**

No further update on this matter.

23/125 **Allotments**

The councillors reviewed the update from the solicitor and expect the contract to be forwarded shortly.

23/126 Parish Infrastructure Investment Plan (PIIP)

The councillors agreed that the draft PIIP be adopted by NPC. A copy will be sent to Babergh and the projects identified in the plan will now be included in NPC's Year Plan for 2023 to 2024.

23/127 **Traffic Calming**

The Clerk reported that SCC Highways had confirmed that they will not support having a SID located permanently on the two posts at each end of Newton's 30mph zone. The suggestion from SCC Highways for Newton to take part in the ANPR pilot scheme will be investigated by James Finch, as to the best of his knowledge, Newton had been put forward for the pilot 18 months ago.

23/128 **NPC** communication options

The councillors reviewed a plan for a bi-monthly email subscription service to Newton residents, giving an overview of NPC matters. The councillors agreed to the scheme starting in July, subject to the resident's request for the service being in accordance with NPC's GDPR guidelines.

Village Hall and Trust updates

No Trust report was presented. The Village Hall Committee are meeting next week.
